Kapi'olani Community College utilizes standard budgets which are updated annually by the University of Hawai'i Office of the Vice President for Academic Planning and Policy. The budgets are a reflection of the changes in national cost of living figures and local community costs. The cost of attendance includes more than the items the student pays to the institution.

HOW YOUR NEED IS DETERMINED

$$\begin{aligned} & \text{Cost of Attendance (COA)} \\ & - \text{Student Aid Index} \\ & - \text{Other Financial Assistance} \\ & = \text{Financial Need} \end{aligned}$$

By law, federal aid recipients cannot receive more aid than their Cost of Attendance. The Student Aid Index (SAI) is based on the income and asset information provided on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). *SAI of -1500 - 0 equates to 0 (zero) in the above calculation.*

The table below is based on full-time (12 credits) enrollment for 9 months (Fall & Spring semesters) during the 2024-2025 academic year.

\* Resident tuition cost is \$3,144/year (\$1,572 semester) full-time/12 credits or \$131 per credit. Non-resident tuition cost is \$8,280 per year (\$4,140 per semester) full-time/12 credits or \$345 per credit.

\*\* New non-resident students add one time \$25 application fee.

\*\*\* Effective July 1, 2011, the cost of attendance will include only an allowance to cover basic expenses incurred for food (not housing) for students living in housing provided on a military base or for which a basic living allowance is provided.

Upon student's request, additional costs for books/supplies required for certain majors, documented child care, neighbor island travel allowance and/or educational expenses related to disability that is not provided by other assisting agencies may be considered for the Federal Direct Loan Program.
