B.A. IN SECOND LANGUAGE STUDIES

The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the smooth transition of students completing the Associate in Arts (AA) degree <u>and</u> the Certificate of Competence (CO), Educational Paraprofessionals Emphasis: Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL), <u>or</u> the Associate in Science (AS) degree: Educational Paraprofessional with a Specialization in Second Language Teaching (SLT), <u>or</u> the CO-TESOL at Kapi'olani Community College (KCC) to the Bachelor of Arts (BA) program in Second Language Studies (SLS) in the College of Languages, Linguistics and Literature (LLL) at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa (UHM).

- This agreement is valid for students who complete either the AA degree <u>and</u> the CO-TESOL, <u>or</u> the AS:SLT, <u>or</u> the CO-TESOL, and who are admitted to the BA program in Second Language Studies (SLS) at UHM according to stated admission criteria.
- The AA degree meets the general education requirements for the BA in SLS as listed in Attachment I.
- The AS:SLT meets the general education requirements <u>plus</u> the SLS course requirements for the BA in SLS as listed in Attachment II.
- The CO-TESOL meets the SLS course requirements for the BA in SLS as listed in Attachment III.
- A minimum grade of C (not C-) is required for all KCC courses stated in this agreement.

As part of this agreement, the Department of SLS will continue to collaborate with KCC to ensure that accurate information is provided to students. SLS will partner with the appropriate KCC program faculty and counselors in providing students with academic advising on College of LLL admission and program course requirements. The College of LLL administration will help to facilitate meetings with faculty and administrators as needed to discuss changes or revisions to this agreement.

This agreement shall be reviewed when deemed necessary and revised as appropriate due to curriculum or admission changes at either institution. Changes to the agreement will be communicated to or by either party. This agreement shall remain in force until either institution makes a decision to terminate it. It is agreed that if terminated, UHM-SLS will honor the terms of the agreement until students already admitted are given the opportunity to complete their BA in SLS in a timely manner.

Any student who demonstrates that he or she has foreign language skills equal to the 102 level (or higher) may request a waiver of the foreign language credit requirement.

Please note: In order to receive the AS Educational Paraprofessional, Second Language Teaching degree a grade of "C" or higher must be maintained in all Educational Paraprofessional and SLT courses.

Note: These AS-SLT degree requirements are 1 FG credit short of fulfilling the AA general education requirements for the BA in SLS.

Additional SLS course requirements for the BA in SLS:

One SLS 480-alpha course will be waived, and replaced with an SLS elective of the student's choice, thereby adding to the breadth of knowledge gained through completion of the BA in SLS degree.

In their first semester in the BA in SLS, former SLT students will enroll in either SLS 399 or SLS 499, which will count as an SLS elective, in which they will complete a project (e.g.: write a paper, compile a portfolio, make a video) that synthesizes their service learning experiences while in the SLT program and that shows application of SLT/SLS concepts.
