Qualification for Program Entry & Selection Criteria

Acceptance into the Community Health Worker Certificate program is based on (1) enrollment at Kapi'olani Community College (2) completion of the CHW Enrollment Google Form (3) attendance at a mandatory Information Session

Students will be admitted for the Fall semester in July of each year. Students will be admitted in the Spring semester in December of each year. Students must complete all qualifying requirements by the application deadline in order to be considered for enrollment. Registration instructions will be provided once a student is accepted to the program and has RSVP'd.
