Island Roots, Global Reach; Perspectives from Ireland

Ireland's island history can be seen all over its landscape and seascape, from the dramatic Wild Atlantic Way, to the sacred tombs of the ancients, the forts of the tribal chieftains, and the castles of the colonizers. This trip is a chance to see it all in person, and learn about the people and places that shaped its past.

This course in Ireland explores how environment, culture and history have shaped indigenous and post-colonial Irish culture. There are many narratives we share with Hawai'i, including fascinating comparisons with our native language, music, rituals, customs and traditions.

Highlights include:

- Pre-Travel Online Preparation Course on the Narratives of Ireland
- Field trips associated with mythology, history, literature and language, led by expert local guides
- Travel to Ireland's famous Wild Atlantic Way and spend time in Ireland's capital city Dublin.
- Visit Ireland's Gaelic-speaking offshore islands
- Surfing at one of Europe's best spots, and Ireland's surf capital, Bundoran
- Opportunities to sample fabulous food at local restaurants, hear Irish traditional music, and see Irish movies and art.

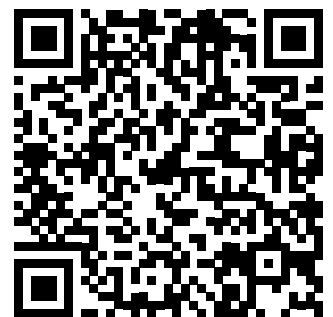
