- Goal to reach 50% by 2021



- Returning Adults: \$200,000: There are 95,000 people 25-44
  in the state with "some college"; 88% of students leaving UH
  without a degree are CC students.
- Prep for comprehensive campaign in Spring 2019 for Fall 2019 enrollment
- Address policy issues (e.g., rollover admission, financial obligations)
- Implement "shark tank" innovations for integrated student support, including one-stop call centers
- New STAR functionality for returning adults
- Innovation funds for each campus (\$10K) to support "working age adults"
