# UH Mānoa Courses taken by Kapi`olani CC Transfers during their First Transfer Year for AY 18-19

### Methodology

Students selected for this study were home based and enrolled at Kap`iolani Community College during the 2017-2018 academic year. These students were also vetted to ensure that they were classified as undergraduate students. Students who were special early admits were excluded from this study. Data was collected from the Operational Data Store (ODS) after any of the census freeze dates (fall, spring). The sample return was found to be 8,498 unique students. Of this sample population, 522 students transferred to the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa (UHM) between their last semester at Kapi`olani CC and spring 2019 (excluding summer).

Course enrollment data at UHM was then collected and analyzed.

**Table 4:** Majority of the Enrollments at UHM 300 level seem to be in the College of Business. It appears at first glance that Kapi`olani CC is doing very well in preparing students to enter the College of Business at the junior level during their first transfer year.

**Table 5:** A good portion of the courses taken at the 400 level were in Nursing. This would indicate that Kapi`olani CC's nursing program is doing an excellent job in its transfer pathway to UHM.

#### Conclusion

All in all, students who transfered from Kapi`olani CC to UHM were prepared to take advanced courses in a breadth of subjects from Business to Zoology. It should be noted that almost a third of the students were still taking courses at the 100-200 level. This constituted 1,300 semester hours.

When calculating what students would have paid in tuition had they chosen to take these courses at Kapi`olani cc, you get a total of \$170,300 on lost tuition (equation 1).

**Equation 1**: (1,300 credit hours) (\$131/hour) =\$170,300.00

Instead, students chose to pay the \$471.00 per credit at UHM which equates to them paying a total of \$612,300.00 (equation 2).

**Equation 2**: (1,300 credit hours) (\$471.00/credit)=\$612,300.00

In essence, Kapi`olani CC lost out on \$170,300.00 in tuition, and more importantly, students ended up paying \$442,000.00 more in tuition for courses that could have been taken at Kapi`olani CC.
