The Lunalilo Scholars Program at Kapi‘olani Community College is a unique program whose mission is to provide opportunities for transformative college experiences for students who have not considered higher education as a viable alternative because of financial or other barriers limiting college access. Through scholarship, academic and personal support and a sense of community, students will build a foundation for success in the first year of college as measured by student engagement, learning, and achievement. Preference is given to Native Hawaiian applicants.

If accepted into this program, students are eligible to receive up to 13 credits of tuition assistance, as well as, assistance with fees, textbooks and supplies, along with many other types of support and access to campus services.

Note to Referrer

Every application for the Lunalilo Scholars Program **MUST** be accompanied by a referral. Examples of a Referrer are teachers, counselors, coaches, social workers, advocates, pastors or mentors. **Referrals cannot be from parents, relatives or friends.**

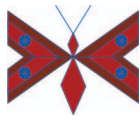
By submitting the following referral, you are helping our committee determine the applicant’s eligibility for the program. Please share information that would help the scholarship committee to understand the applicant’s current life situation and how this program could benefit them. **This is not a typical scholarship** because we provide personal support during the first year of college; therefore sharing their barriers will help us identify if they qualify for the program. If the student has no barriers to attending college, they will likely **NOT** be accepted.

Thank you for taking the time to complete this referral form on the applicant’s behalf. If a referral form is not submitted on the applicant’s behalf, his/her application will **NOT** be considered. Applications without a referral are considered incomplete and will **NOT** be reviewed.

If the applicant is awarded this scholarship, he/she is **REQUIRED to attend a Program Orientation, a Summer Bridge Program (3 college credits) and a Math Brush-Up. Failure to complete requirements will deem them ineligible to receive the scholarship.**

Students accepted into this program must be a 2022 high school graduate OR have a high school diploma OR have a GED by August 1, 2022. Students accepted into this program must be a state resident as determined by the University of Hawai‘i System Application Form. They **DO NOT** need to be accepted to Kapi‘olani Community College before submitting this application, but they **MUST** be accepted to Kapi‘olani Community College for the 2022 - 2023 Academic Year and KCC must be their home campus to receive the scholarship. In order to receive this scholarship they must be living on O‘ahu for the 2022 - 2023 Academic Year. Students cannot commute from other islands and/or take all classes online with this scholarship.

Applicants will be notified of the status of their application by email by May 27, 2022.



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Priority Deadline

Complete applications (application and referral form) that are received by **April 15, 2022** will be reviewed first.

Deadline

Online referral forms should be submitted by the priority date of **Friday, April 22, 2022** (one week after the application is due). Paper referral forms must be postmarked by the priority date of Friday, April 22, 2022. We hope to fill as many spots as possible and notify students by May 27, 2022, if they have been accepted; however, we will leave the application open until June 3 or reach 76 students. **Referral forms will be accepted until June 3.** Applications submitted without referral forms will NOT be considered. Applications submitted after the deadline may be considered for the waitlist. A second round of applications may be considered if there is not a sufficient number of 1st round applicants.

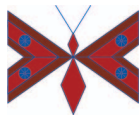

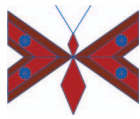

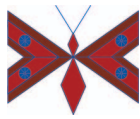
Why do you think the applicant should attend college? How will college help this student? What are the applicant's goals for the future or what do you think is the applicant's potential? (Please be as specific as possible)
