#### **Qualification for Program Entry & Selection Criteria**

Program Support Courses for A.S. Medical Assisting Degree:

Acceptance into the Medical Assisting program is on a best qualified basis and rating system for (1) *qualification* for ENG 100 (2) *qualification* score of 250+ in the Arithmetic Accuplacer Test domain or higher or completion of Math 75X or higher within the last two years (3) grades of completed program support courses; (4) typing test score; and (5) volunteer or work experience.

Applications are located online in <u>Medical Assisting Program "Forms & Documents"</u> on the KCC website. Selection is based on <u>total</u> qualifying scores in rank order from the highest until admission quota is reached. Students must complete all qualifying requirements by the application deadline.

Students on probation, suspension or having a GPA below 2.0 at KCC are not eligible to apply. Priority selection is given to Hawai'i State residents; nonresidents will be considered after all qualified residents have been accommodated per Board of Regents Policy 5.211. A grade of "C" or higher must be maintained in all program requirements to continue in the programs. Transfer credit from accredited institutions requires KCC Department and registrar approval.

\*Applicants to the Certificate of Achievement (C.A.) degree in Medical Assisting are not required to complete the above Program Support Courses. Upon program admissions, majors will follow a prescribed one-year curriculum.

Applicants to the Associates in Science (A.S) degree for Medical Assisting will follow the one-year prescribed C.A curriculum and complete the Associates degree curriculum including the program support courses.
