Selective Admissions Criteria

Admissions is based on a BEST QUALIFIED rating system for (1) grades of completed prerequisites (2) MICT Personal Essay (3) State of Hawaii Traffic Abstract (4) current Hawaii driver's license; (5) proof of current AHA BLS CPR card (6) Hawaii State Certification as an EMT (7) work experience (8) BLS Team Lead Report documenting 100 Team Leads 9) Health immunization records. Upon applying to the program, additional steps will include (10) Oral Interview (11) EMT written comprehensive knowledge exam (12) EMT Psychomotor Competency Exam. Selection is based on total qualifying scores in rank order.

The MICT program on Maui, Hawai'i, and Kaua'i requires a minimum of six students each.

Applications are located in the <u>MICT webpage</u>. Students must complete all prerequisites by the application deadline. Students on probation, suspension or having a GPA below 2.0 at KapCC are not eligible for admissions. A grade of "C" or higher must be maintained in all program requirements to continue in the program.

Priority selection is given to Hawai'i State residents; nonresidents will be considered after all qualified residents have been accommodated per Board of Regents Policy 5.211
