Selective Admissions Criteria

Admissions is based on a BEST QUALIFIED rating system for (a) grades of completed prerequisites, (b) the letter of recommendation reference score (must be completed in the same academic year as the application period), (c) any previous degree completed. Selection is based on <u>total</u> qualifying scores in rank order from the highest until admission quota is reached.

Program applications are located in the <u>Physical Therapist Assistant webpage</u>. Students must complete all admissions criteria by the application deadline to be fully qualified.

Students on probation, suspension or having a GPA below 2.0 at KCC are not eligible for admissions. A grade of "C" or higher must be maintained in all program requirements to continue in the program.

Priority selection is given to Hawai'i State residents; nonresidents will be considered after all qualified residents have been accommodated per <u>Board of Regents Policy 5.211</u>.

Co-Requisite Courses

HLTH courses within the PTA curriculum may be taken prior to program entry to lighten your load once admitted. No additional points are awarded on the application for completing corequisite coursework. It is recommended that all co-requisite courses are taken no earlier than one-year prior to program acceptance. (i.e. If you are admitted Fall 2023, it is recommended your co-requisite courses are taken no earlier than Fall 2022.) If students take all co-requisite coursework, they may drop below full-time status which may have an effect on financial aid.
