Context

From March 13th to April 8th, 2021, **506 students participated in the Spring 2021 Student Congress Survey** via a link sent through campus email. That's 9% out of 5,792 students enrolled at Kapi'olani CC . Although the return rate is lower than previous semesters, **results are still statistically significant**, meaning **our results are less likely the result of coincidence**. We can say that our results would be within percentage points of the real population value of all students 95% of the time.

Part-Time: Full-Time Student Ratio

The biggest mismatch in the data set compared to the general student population is the reversal of the part-time to full-time student ratio. In general, we have three part time students to every two full-time students. However, since full-time students spend more time interacting with the campus, they may be more likely to take a survey.

Age

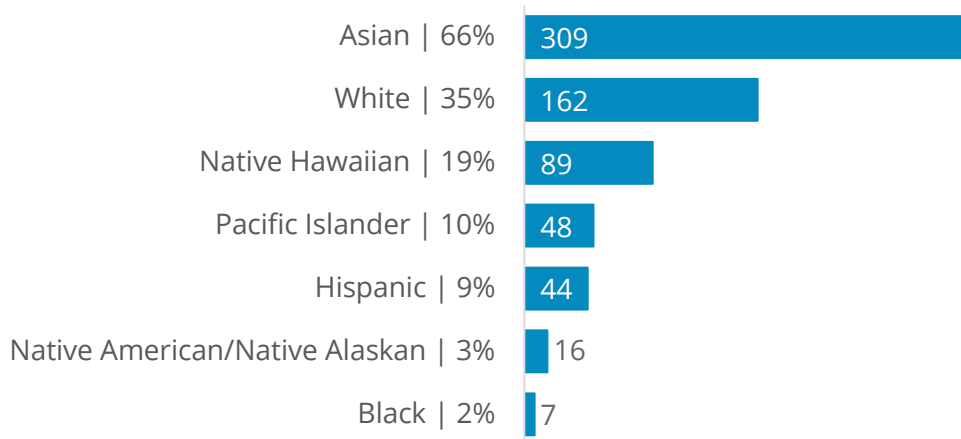
Most survey takers are **between 18 and 34** years old, matching our student population.

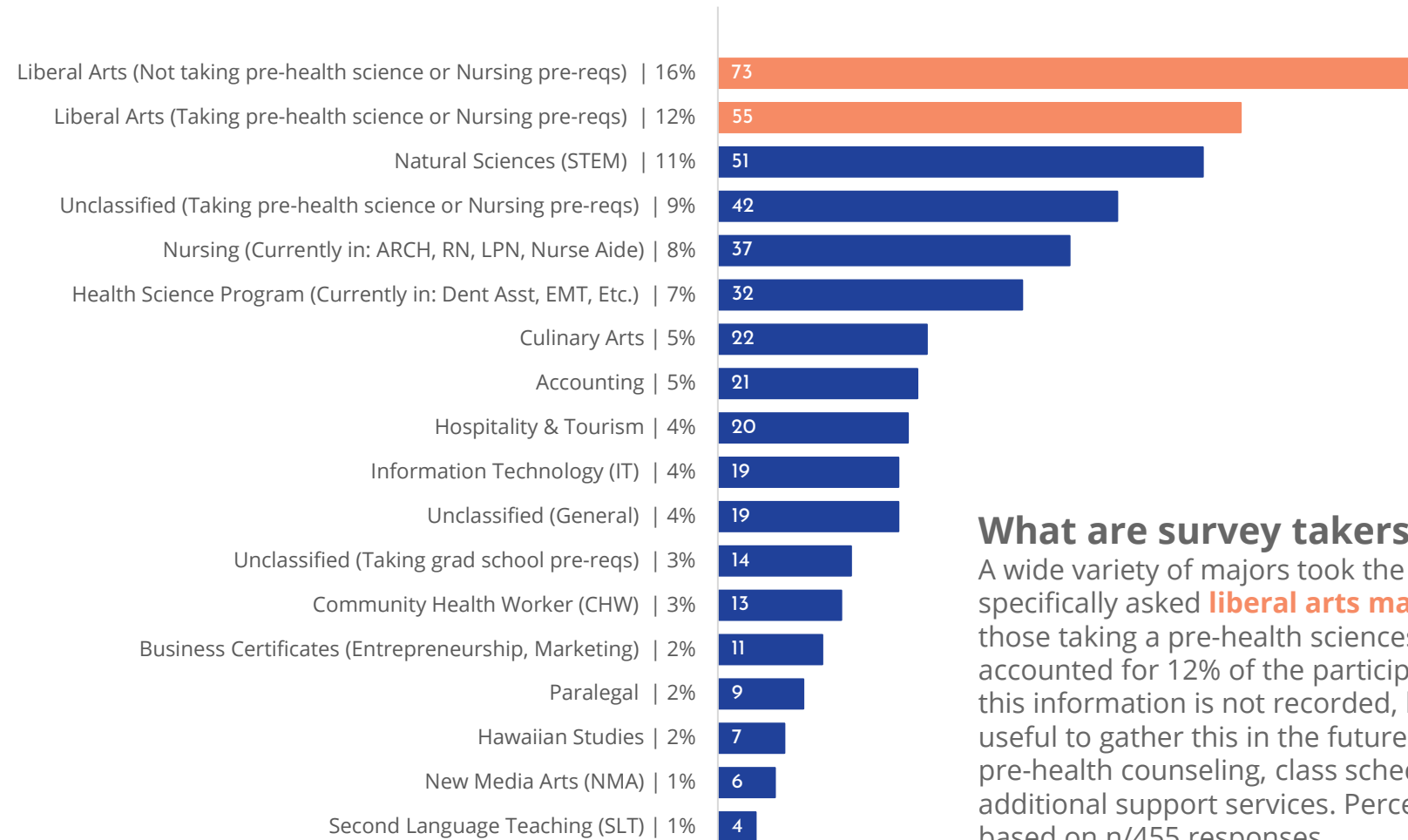
74% of Participants were female.

In spring 2021, 62% of the KCC population was female, so they are overrepresented in this survey.

Ethnicity

Our numbers differ from the typical data on ethnicity. Why is that? **Students could pick “all that apply.”** Typically, in institutional data, if students pick more than one ethnicity, it will be classified as “mixed race.” If students pick more than one ethnicity and include Native Hawaiian, it is automatically coded as Native Hawaiian.





What are survey takers studying?

A wide variety of majors took the survey. We specifically asked **liberal arts majors** to identify those taking a pre-health sciences track, which accounted for 12% of the participants. Typically, this information is not recorded, but it may be useful to gather this in the future to help with pre-health counseling, class scheduling, and additional support services. Percentages are based on n/455 responses.

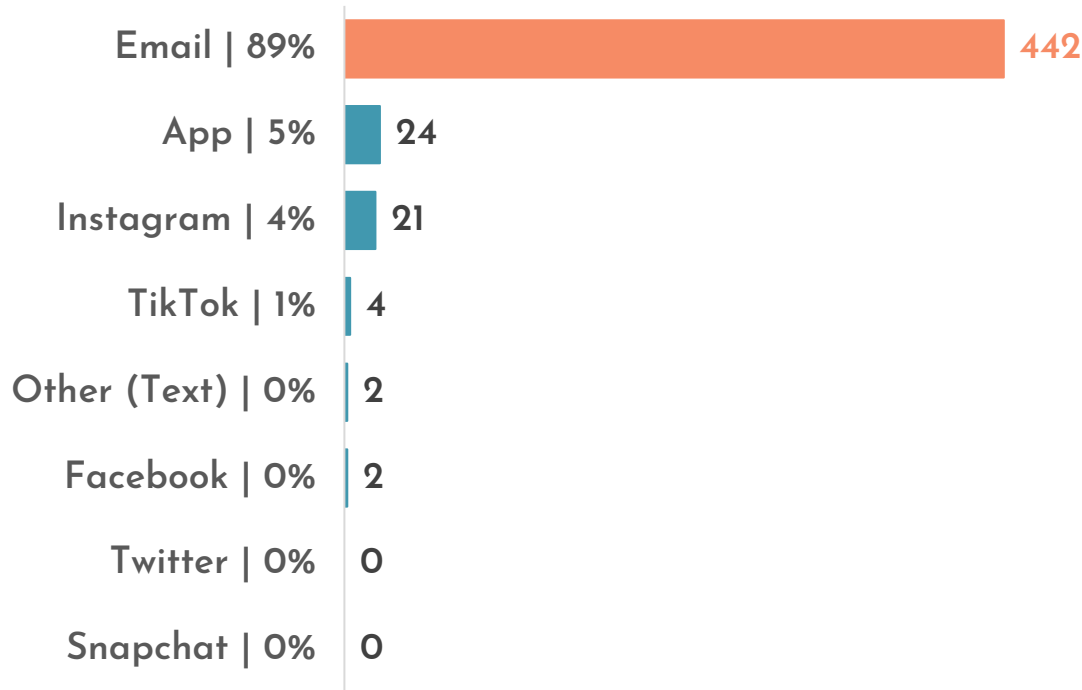

Q4. Which would be your most preferred way to receive KCC information electronically?

Respondents selected email as their primary preference to receive information.

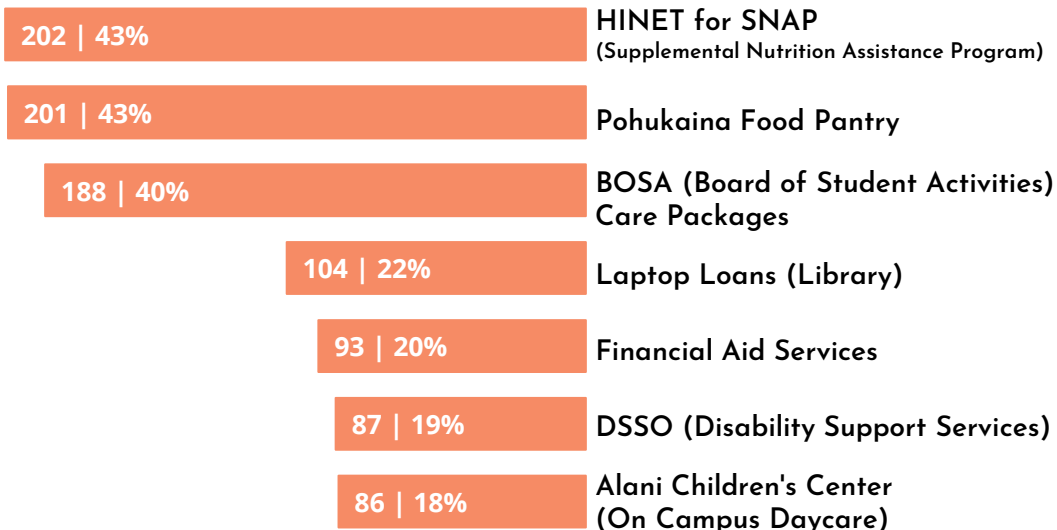
We can argue that the students received the link to this survey via email, so there will be a biased preference for that medium. However, this also aligns with the findings of the 2021 Student Communication Survey, which included a link in materials physically mailed to students. In that survey, 75% (n=190) of those 256 participants had heard of the survey through email compared to 29% (n=75) through physical mail. Furthermore, 81% (n=207) of those participants said email was their first choice to receive “information about Kapi’olani CC student support services, resources, and deadlines.”



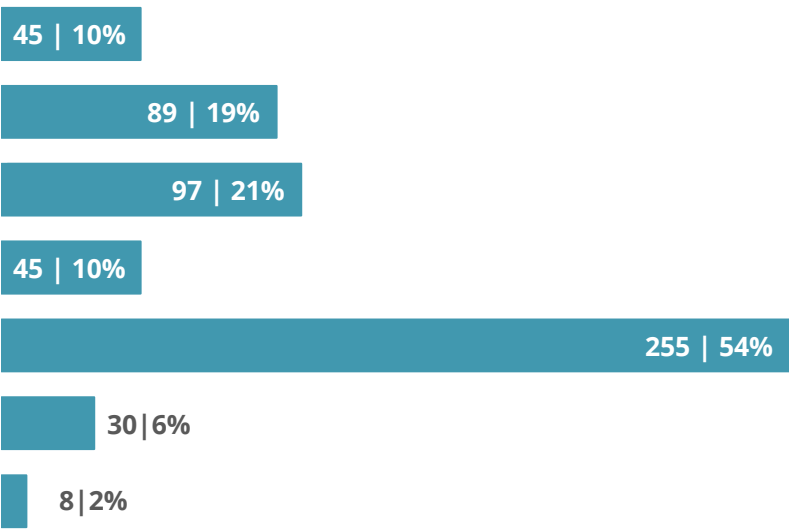
Q5. How familiar are you with the following services our campus provides to its students?

Four out of ten students were not familiar with HINET for SNAP, the Pohukaina Food Pantry, or the BOSA Care Packages, but may use those services now that they are aware. One in five students said the same for laptop loans, financial aid services, DSSO, and the Children's Center. A detailed table on page 37 contains the numbers and percentages for all categories, including those who are not familiar and won't use the services, as well as those who are familiar and do not use services. If Student Congress asks this question in the future, it will benefit from collecting email addresses in order to share lists with relevant stakeholders. For instance, if HINET received the list of 202 students interested in SNAP, it could check the eligibility status for those learners.

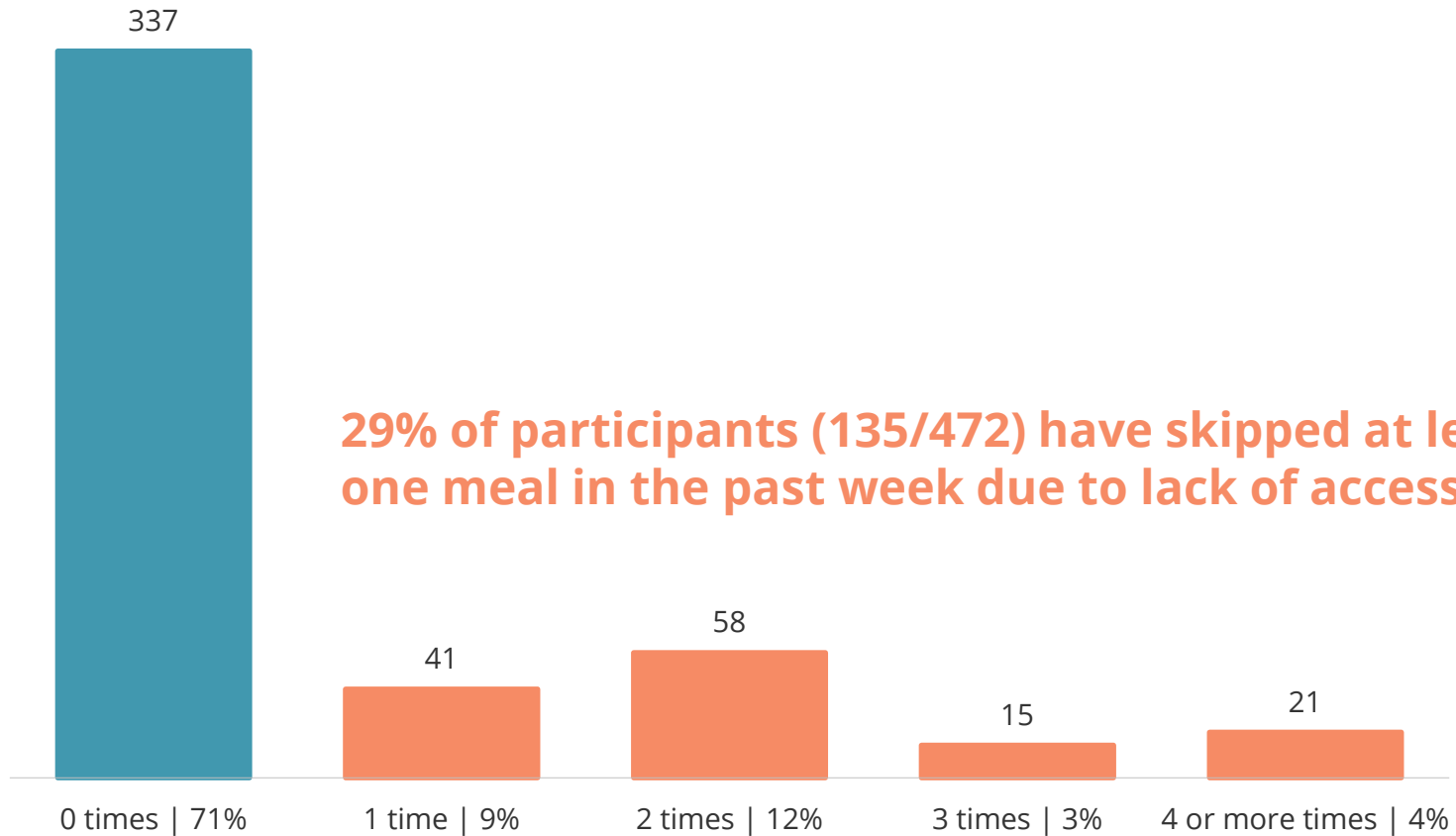

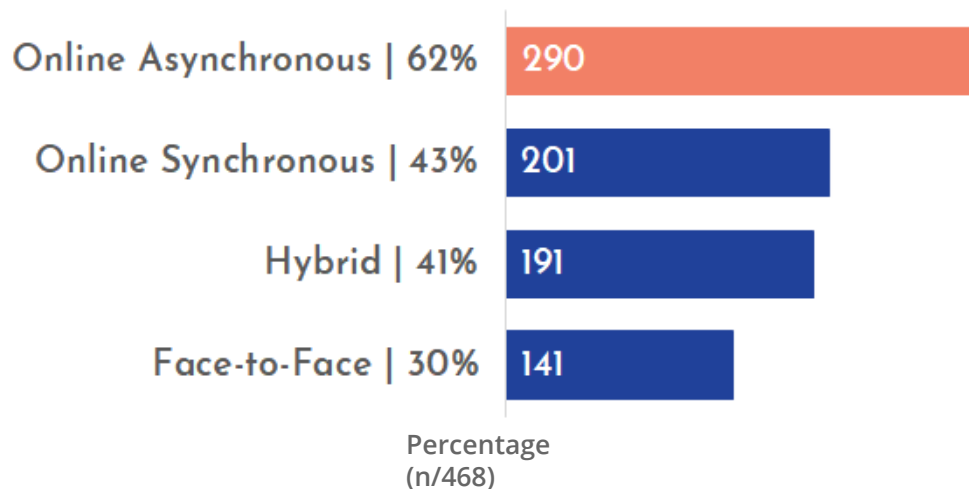


Q7. In the past week, how many meals did you miss because you didn't have access to food?



Q8. What are your preferred class methods for fall 2021? (Check all that apply.)

3 out of 5 participants selected online asynchronous as their preferred class modality. Preliminary feedback shows that this may be one of the more controversial findings. Comments have included that these results are “useless since the percentages add up to more than 100%” and “students who took the survey found it in email,” implying that those savvy enough to take the survey would prefer a technological approach to learning. The percentages will be more than 100% since students could choose more than one option. Further research around this would include distributing this survey in other ways besides email (although that is the preferred method), as well as breaking down preference by major to help department chairs with planning for courses. In addition, OFIE will look at fill rates and enrollment numbers for online classes compared to face-to-face to check for any significant differences in patterns.



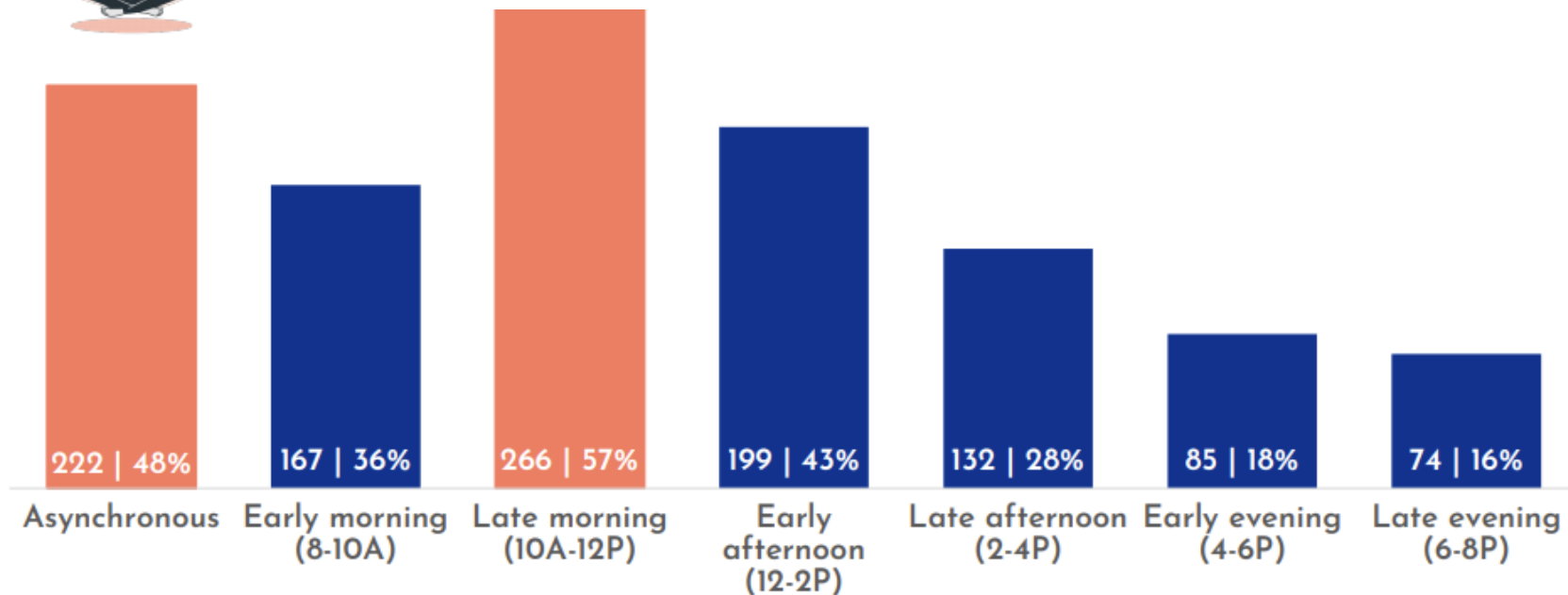

Q9. What is your preferred time to take classes? (Check all that apply.)

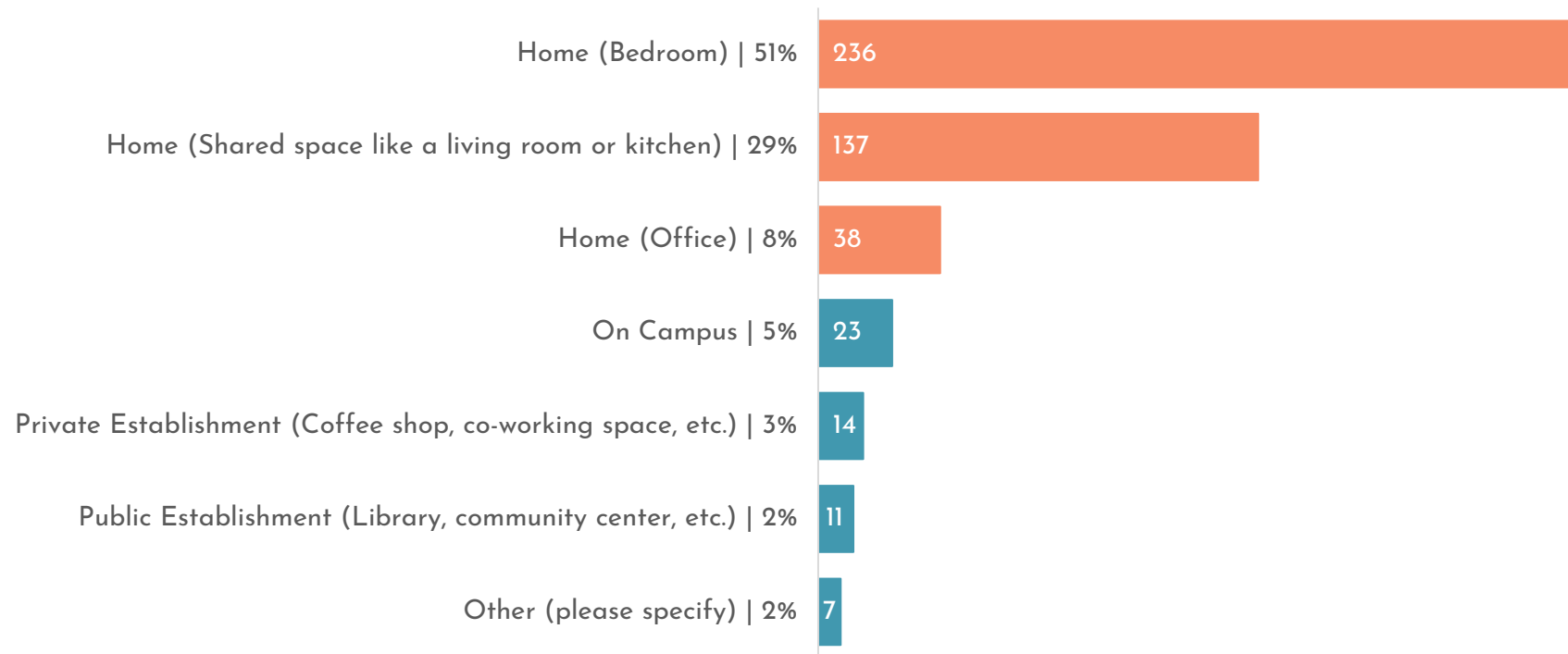
Most survey participants prefer late morning classes.

Filtering by major may be helpful for scheduling purposes. Of note: Although 290 students selected asynchronous learning as a preferred class method, only 222 participants selected that option for preferred time. Percentages are based on n/466.



Q10. What is your primary place to study?

88% of respondents study at home with the most students studying in their bedroom. How does a lack of dedicated space impact learning? What follows on the next slides are the reasons why students selected their responses, which have been thematically coded by Student Congress and OFIE.

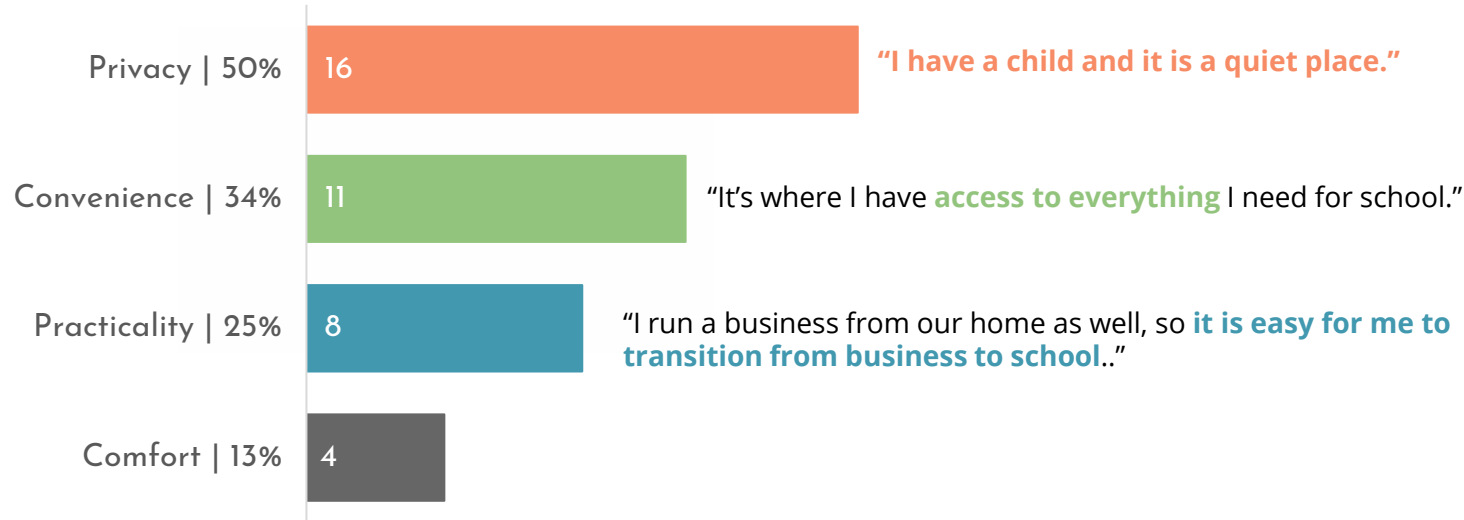


Why is your **home bedroom** your primary place to study?



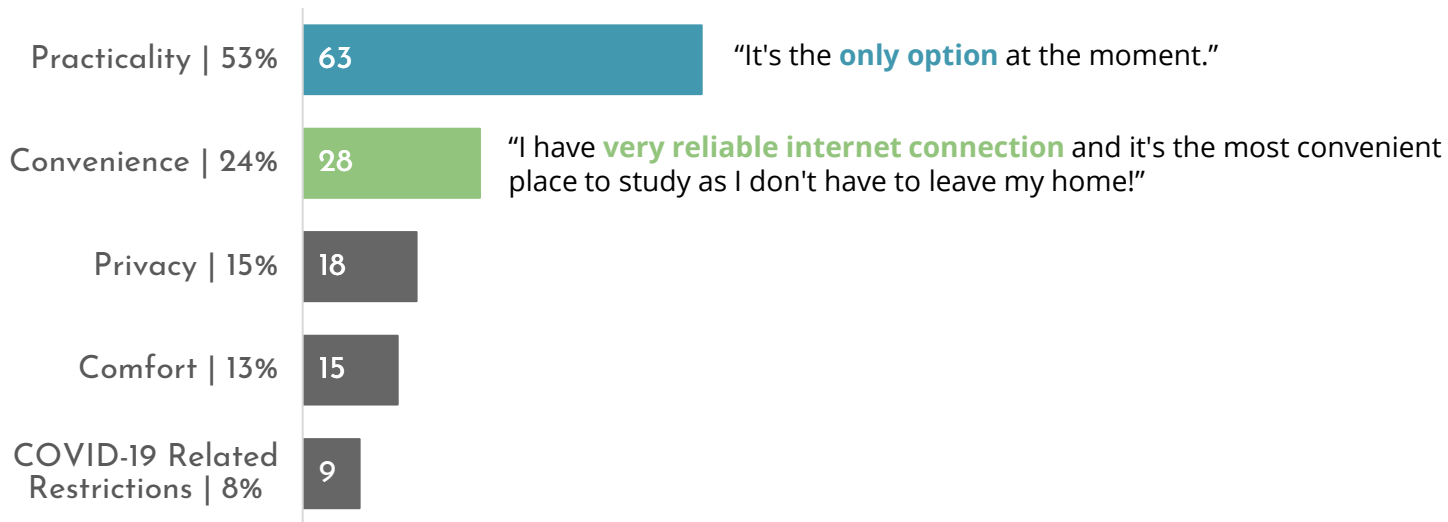

Why is your **home office** your primary place to study?



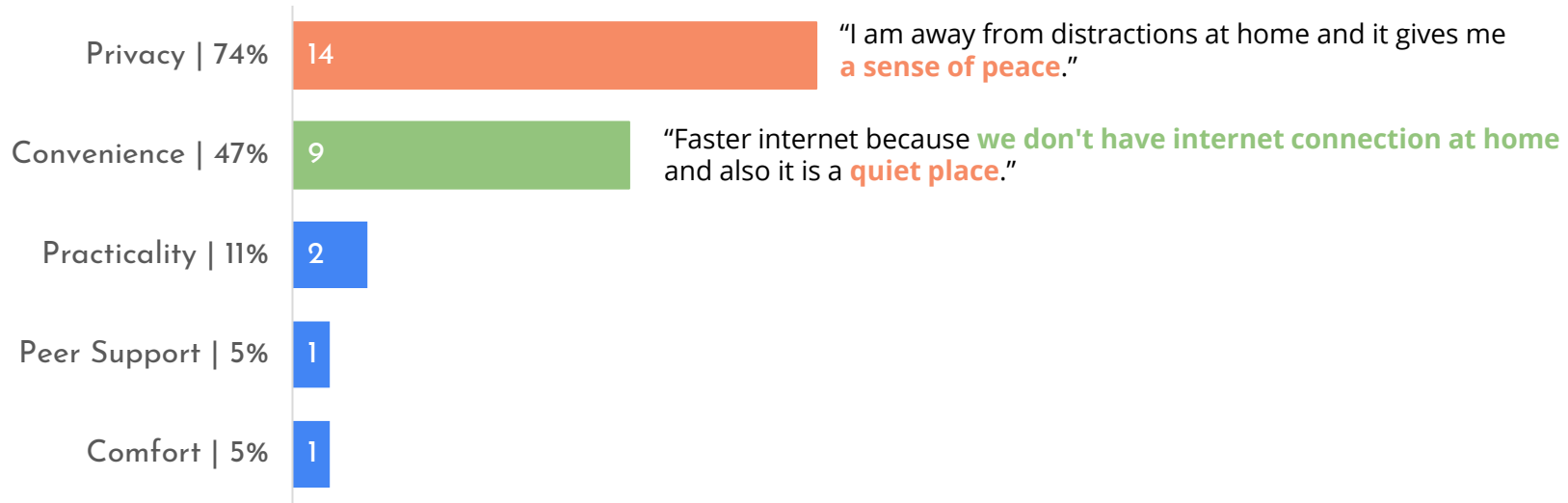

Why is your **shared space at home** your primary place to study?



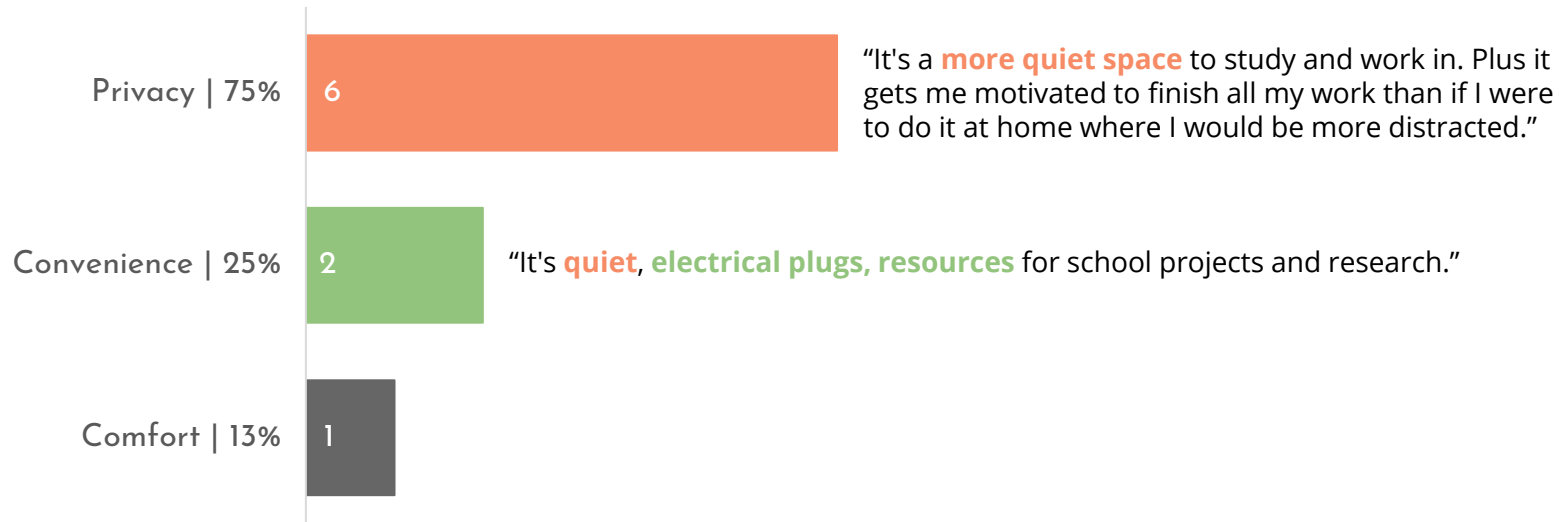

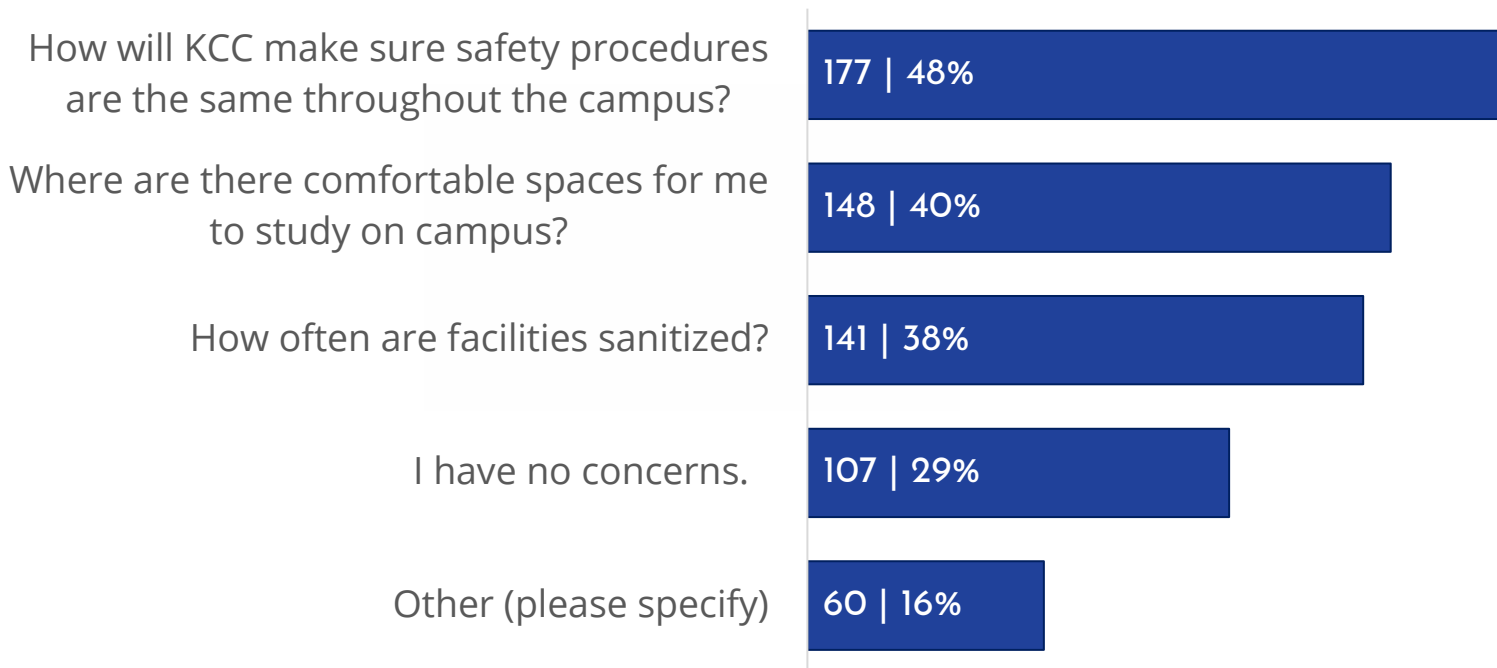
Seven students selected “other.” Their reasons are listed below:

Study Space	Reason Why
Coffee shops *Should have been moved to “Public Spaces”	I can concentrate and it makes me focus more rather than being at home
Home - wherever my son is hanging out	He's my top priority, he doesn't like to stay in 1 room too long so I'm usually just following him around with my notes or laptop.
Lama Library	Helps me to focus on studying. If I ever need any kind of help, the librarians are super helpful.
Living room or coffee shop	Just to be able to have different spaces in my routine , to allow more motivation
On Campus and Home-shared space	I am on campus during the week at least 3-5 times a week and then I also study at home.
Parents Home	It relieves me of my distractions.
Work	I work nights and have quiet, uninterrupted time away from my family to study. I have a large desk and comfortable chair so I don't need many breaks.

Q13. What concerns do you have for fall 2021 on campus?

Eighty percent of survey takers (n=374) revealed that they will register for fall 2021 classes.

We asked what concerns they have for returning to campus in fall 2021. 370 students responded with the following. Percentages are based out of n/370. Students could select multiple answers, which is why the percentage total is greater than 100%.



Sixty students selected “other” regarding on-campus concerns for fall 2021. Pages 21-26 contain their verbatim responses.

Student Congress may want to share concerns under each category with the relevant leadership, so they are made aware of these challenges that students may face.

Preference for Online Coursework or Currently Taking Courses Online (n=13)

All of the above if I have to go on campus. Main concern is if they will offer classes I need and if they will be online because I have kids that need attended to.

Are there sanitizer stations? Do all teachers have a standard for training on how to minimize giving/receiving handouts, student desk spacing, etc? Will the campus continue to support students with disabilities by allowing distance learning via zoom call if they are incapable of coming into class, but able to be present by call?

My desktop computer is now my main study resource and i can't bring that to campus with me

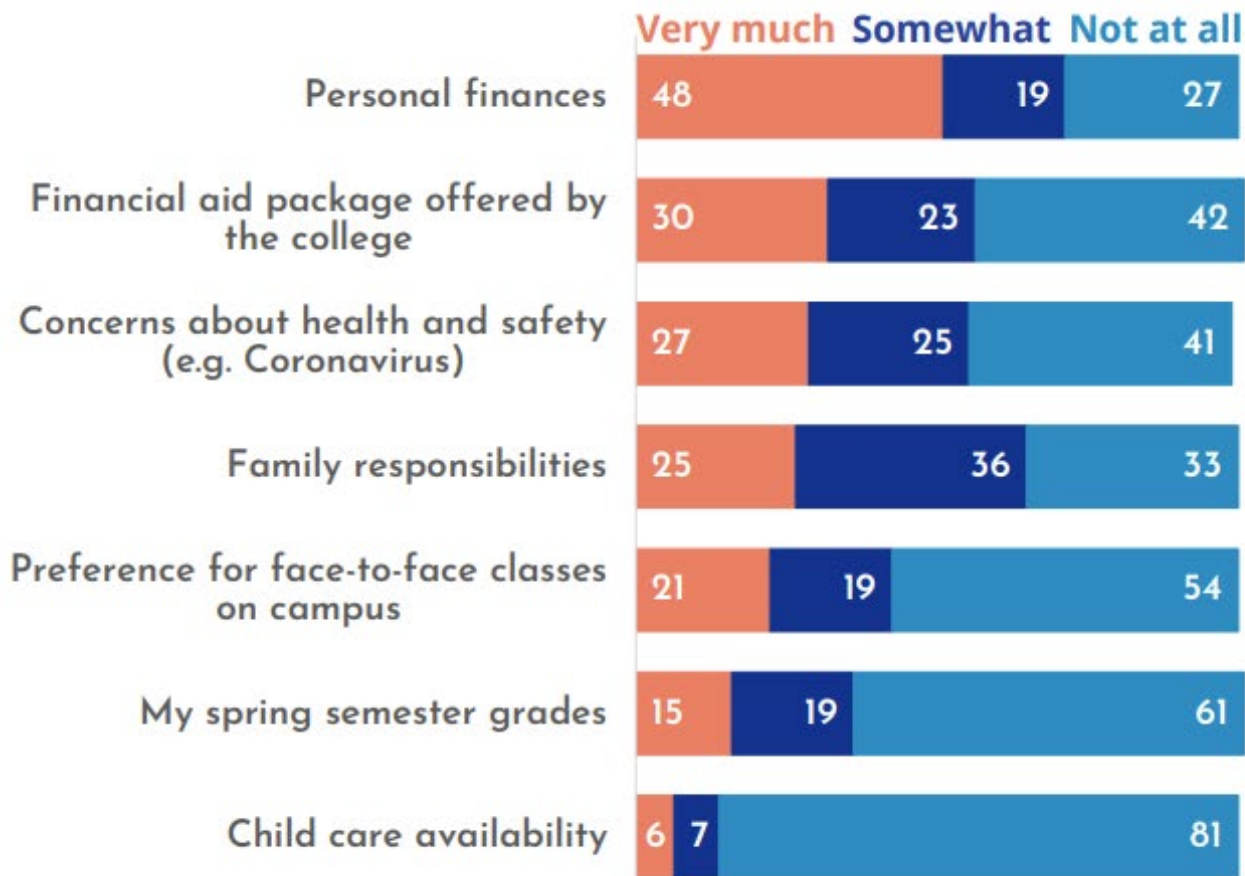
Returning to face-to-face classes, and people still being overly paranoid about COVID.

What follows on pages 29-35 are individual comments by category from 41 participants.

Academic Affairs (n=7)

I am a little frustrated with classes, even though it is asynchronous, it was not only my ONLY option, but there is limited support unless I bother them to teach the whole lesson in office hours or email them constantly. I am struggling with this very much.

I hope there will be the summer biology (I and II) classes available so I can stay on schedule of completing my physical therapy school prerequisites.

I'd love to have Dance back on the classes available to take.

Some faculties and instructors do not do their job properly. I wonder where and how to report that.

Some professors are not quite eligible for professor position. They don't know how to make clear class materials and they are being too strict for nothing. I hope KCC have better qualities professors in Fall 2021

Would really like dance to be back up for classes to take.

Would your school be able to offer a cosmetology program? HCC has a great program, but they are not at all flexible with working adults.

Student Affairs (n=5)

Communication through email should be faster with counselors.

DSSO needs to be trained as they are currently making it difficult to access help/invalidating of psychiatric disorders.

I appreciate all of the care packages and food pantries you have all hosted/given throughout the pandemic. It's helped a lot with morale and with basic necessities I need.
