The following are minimum physical abilities needed to successfully perform the duties of a radiologic technologist. A physician must certify that the student being examined has the ability to perform all tasks.

Technical Skill	Standard	Examples
Vision	Ability to work in variable lighting conditions (dark, dimly lit, or bright light). Adequate peripheral vision; spatial and depth perception; ability to distinguish between varying shades of color.	 Read fine print/handwritten instructions, equipment settings. Accurately focus light beam on specific point. Discriminate details at close range. Distinguish between shades of gray.
Hearing, Verbal Communication	Ability to monitor patient and equipment function while taking diagnostic images. Ability to effectively communicate with patients and other healthcare providers.	 Detect and discriminate between sounds of normal conversation. Converse with patients and staff. Follow verbal instructions; respond promptly to patient needs. Give and receive information over phone.
Mobility, Strength	Mobility and strength sufficient to support and move patients and/or imaging equipment.	 Move patients and equipment in and out of examination areas. Turn, move, and stabilize patients safely. Reach for and move fixed imaging equipment.
Motor Skills	Gross and fine motor skills sufficient for safe and efficient handling of imaging equipment, positioning aids, and other items used in diagnostic imaging.	 Make fine adjustments in operating equipment. Steadily manipulate imaging equipment or assist/position patients.
Tactile Perception	Tactile ability sufficient for physical assessment.	 Distinguish between textures, degrees of firmness, temperature differences. Distinguish hot or cool skin temperature, pulse rate.
Physical Stamina	Ability to remain standing or walk around for long periods of time during work shift.	 Stand by with imaging equipment until needed during long surgeries or ER cases. Transport patients and/or equipment as needed within the department or hospital.
