MATH 100 (Survey of Mathematics): A grade of A in MATH 24, or a grade of C or higher in MATH 75x or MATH 25 or MATH 81 or MATH 82, or qualification for MATH 100; and qualification for ENG 22 or ESOL 94.

MATH 103 (Fundamentals of College Algebra): A grade of C or higher in MATH 25 or MATH 82, or qualification for MATH 103. Recommended preparation: Qualification for ENG 100.

PHIL 110 (Introduction to Deductive Logic): Qualification for ENG 100 or ESL 100.
